

## Principles of Redemption Chronology

Principle	Meaning	Description
<b>1</b> $6 + 1 = 7$	6 days + 1 day  6 years + 1 year	7 days of Creation Week <b>Sabbath Rest every seven days</b>  Land Cycle for cultivation <b>Sabbath Rest every seven years</b>
<b>2</b> One Day is as a Thousand Years	6,000 years + 1,000 years	7,000 years of time in Redemption Chronology <b>Sabbath Rest in The Millennium</b>
<b>3</b> The Jubilee Cycle	49 years + 1 year	49 years to man (+ one Jubilee) 50 years to God <b>490 years counted as 500 years</b>
<b>4</b> Counted Periods & Unreckoned Periods	490-year periods (Times of Forgiveness)	Time out of fellowship was not counted, so <b>three Jewish periods were longer than 490 years</b>
<b>5</b> The Lunar Year	12 lunar months (A 'Civil Lunar' Year)	God counts Redemption Time in <b>Civil Lunar Years of 354 days</b>
<b>6</b> A 'Time'	360 days	<b>Babylonian Year</b> (Gentile Year) <b>7 Times = 7 Years</b> (2,520 days)
<b>7</b> The Day-Year Principle	1 day $\equiv$ 1 year	E.g. <b>2,520 days <math>\equiv</math> 2,520 years</b> ( $\equiv$ means 'is equivalent to')
<b>8</b> Times of The Gentiles	2,520 years (7 'Times', in years)	<b>The Gentile Domination of Israel</b> 2,520 solar years of Gentile domination
